

## **VOTE "NO" ON REAL ID — BIG GOVERNMENT "DUAL-TRACK" BILLS**

HF 3959 (Smith)/SF 3589 (Dibble)

1) NO SUCH THING: There's no such thing as a "non-compliant" driver's license. The House and Senate bills require *all* cards to be compliant with the federal REAL ID Act.

## 2) "DUAL-TRACK" MEANS:

- Two types of REAL ID-compliant driver's licenses and MN ID cards: one set of DL/ID "for federal purposes" and one set of DL/ID "not for federal purposes," but both sets under federal control through Congress's REAL ID Act of 2005 and its 2008 Rule.
- MN House and Senate bills authorize a REAL ID card "for federal purposes" <u>and</u> a REAL ID card "not for federal purposes."
- Both MN DL and ID cards would be under the REAL ID Act, according to HF3959/SF3589.
  - HF3959/SF3589 mandate unconstitutional compliance with federal REAL ID Act.
  - o HF3959/SF3589 mandate unconstitutional compliance with federal REAL ID Rule.
- 3) <u>REAL ID ACT HAS CONTROL</u>: If bills adopted, both the "for federal purposes" and "not for federal purposes" licenses/IDs and the issuing of each are under the federal REAL ID law:

"To meet the requirements of this section, a State shall adopt the following practices in the issuance of drivers' licenses and identification cards: ...

- (11) In any case in which the State issues a driver's license or identification card that does not satisfy the requirements of this section ensure that such license or identification card
  - (A) Clearly states on its face that it may not be accepted by any Federal agency for federal identification or any other official purpose; and
  - (B) Uses a unique design or color indicator to alert Federal agency and other law enforcement personnel that it may not be accepted for any such purpose.
- (12) <u>Provide electronic access to all other States</u> to information contained in the motor vehicle database of the State.
- (13) Maintain a State motor vehicle database that contains, at a minimum—
  - (A) All data fields printed on drivers' licenses and identification cards issued by the State; and
  - (B) motor vehicle drivers' histories, including motor vehicle violations, suspensions, and points on licenses." [all emphasis added]
